A thought on Pentecost

The term Pentecost comes from the Greek Πεντηκοστή (*Pentēkostē*) meaning "fiftieth". It refers to the festival celebrated on the fiftieth day after Passover, also known as the "Feast of Weeks" and the "Feast of 50 days" in rabbinic tradition. For the Christian Church, however,

Pentecost is the time when we

remember the coming of the Holy Spirit, after Jesus had ascended into heaven following His resurrection from the dead.

So why do we need the Holy Spirit in our lives today? One of the purposes of His coming is to enable us to live a righteous and faithful life, following Jesus Christ as our Lord and Saviour. He also acts as a comforter or Paraclete, one who intercedes, or supports or acts as an advocate, particularly in times of trial.

I don't know about you, but this country needs a Holy advocate, particularly in these days of Brexit confusion, arguments, and lies. Some of the gifts of the Holy Spirit include wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord.

If you were fortunate, chocolate biscuits were also on offer and, one week, there were even fresh dates brought all the way back from the Holy Land! It was a lovely opportunity to raise funds for a very worthwhile charity and spend time together. Altogether, £510.98 was raised. Thanks to everyone who volunteered their services in making and/or serving and to those who came and enjoyed good food and good conversation.



We had a great time at Messy Church on Palm Sunday. Bill told the Easter story, when Jesus entered into Jerusalem on the donkey's back, to His miraculous Resurrection on Easter morning. A difficult story for anyone, let alone children, to comprehend but he really got across the importance of Jesus' sacrifice because He loves us so much. Hand signs were used to symbolise the important event on each day leading up to the Resurrection and everyone joined in - a good way to remember the story. We sang action songs - clapping hands, stamping feet and waving the green paper palm crosses they had made earlier in the craft time. As well as palm crosses, Egg Disciples were made using stickers and felt tips (see left), beautiful woven crosses (Ellie and Ruby showing us their handiwork), edible Easter Gardens (Joyce worked so hard in baking little chocolate tombs, with a 'stone' and little garden with grass and flowers, all carefully balanced on an edible cracker) and a cross decorated with hand-made flowers which will be on display for the next couple of weeks in the Cheviot Centre. Do go and have a look! We finished off the afternoon with some very yummy food. The next Messy Church will be on Sunday, 9th June (Pentecost Sunday).
